## LONG ISLAND UNITY COLLABORATIVE ACTION STEPS

- 1. Start or join an existing Local Unity Action Committee in your Hamlet/Town.
- 2. Visit your local elected representatives and ask that they sign on to the Principles of Unity.
- 3. Visit your local school board meeting and present the Principles of Unity and ask them to sign on.
- 4. Visit the principal at your local school and ask him/her to sign on to the Principles of Unity.
- 5. Visit the Teachers' association/union for your school district and present the Principles of Unity and ask them to sign on and to hold a Unity Town Hall Meeting in their district.
- 6. Attend local police Precinct meetings and present the Principles of Unity and ask if the Inspector would be willing to sign on.
- 7. Write to the Suffolk County Police Commissioner and ask about signing on to the Principles of Unity.
- 8. Sign up for Trainings.
- 9. Visit your local, state &/or national representatives to advocate/hold them accountable.
- 10. Participate in vigils, rallies etc. in support of groups or issues.
